DRESSAGE

a) Unless otherwise stated, Dressage and Freestyle to Music Classes will be run under BD rules

b) UNDER NSSSG RULES DRESSAGE CLASS RIDER TURNOUT IS AS FOR EQUITATION CLASS TURNOUT

& ADULTS NOT WEARING SAFETY HATS DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK

c) Presentations to Dressage Class Trophy Winners, Special Dressage Awards

& Area Dressage Teams Trophies & place rosettes will be on Friday evening

d) In accordance with NSSSG rules, where the Arena construction makes it impossible for Competitors to ride round the outside, before the judge's signal to enter is sounded, Competitors may ride inside the arena. Where a 40m x 20m arena has been created within a 60m x 20m arena, Competitors are permitted to ride in the entire arena. Competitors may enter at A from inside or outside the arena.

1. Times - See General Show Rules for Times information. Every effort will be made to accommodate Competitors' requests for which pony/horse is ridden first, **provided** requests are made at the time of entry.

2. Bridles, etc. - BD Rules concerning bitting and saddlery, **with the exception** that Double or Pelham bridles are permitted in the Freestyle to Music Classes. Preliminary and Novice tests may only be ridden in Snaffle bridles. (Other tests may be ridden in a Snaffle or Double Bridle). For the Jumping Phase of the Dressage with Jumping classes, Standing Martingales and Market Harboroughs are not permitted. No protection of the horses' legs is permitted in any NSSSG/BD Dressage Test.

3. Scoring - In accordance with BD competitions the total marks for a test will be converted into a percentage and the highest percentage score will be the Winner. In the event of equality of marks/percentages, the horse/pony with the higher collective marks shall take the higher placing. If the collective marks are also equal, the place will be shared. For Dressage with Jumping Classes, see 10.

4. Commanded Tests - Dressage tests may be commanded (except for the Dressage to Music, Rococo and Caro Cripps). **Commanders must be appropriately dressed, wearing a hat.**

5. BD Dressage Sheets - Test sheets may be obtained from the British Dressage Office, Telephone 02476 698830 or <u>www.britishdressage.co.uk</u>

6. Score Sheets for the RDA Intro Test 1 (2013), Rococo and Caro Cripps can be obtained form the Show Website <u>www.nationalsidesaddleshow.co.uk</u> or by sending an SAE to the NSSSG Show Office.

7. Second Entries for rides in dressage classes will be accepted provided the class is not full. A waiting list will be kept, giving priority to first rides in the event of cancellations or withdrawals. Competitors with a wait-listed second entry may declare which horse is to be ridden to the NSSSG Show Office **NO LATER** than 12 noon on the Monday of the week preceding the Show.

8. Freestyle to Music Competitors are required to hand in their music to the Show Office or Commentary Box at least 2 hours before the start of the Class (AND COLLECT AFTERWARDS). Music must be marked with the Competitor's Name, Number and Class Number.

9. Music Licences are **not required** at Addington Manor Equestrian Centre because they hold their own Performing Rights Licence.

10. Dressage with Jumping Rules

a) To be judged in accordance with BD rules for the Dressage phase and BS Rules for the jumping phase, except that a fall of horse or rider or a 3rd disobedience incurs elimination.

b) Competitors must wear a hat to current British Safety Standard or above for the Jumping Phase.

c) Jumping will incur penalties; 1st disobedience - 4 penalties, 2nd - 8, 3rd - Elimination. Knocking down an obstacle will incur 4 penalties. Penalties will be deducted from the Dressage good marks.

d) To avoid an undue influence from the Dressage phase, a multiplying factor will be applied.

e) The Winner shall be the competitor with the highest number of good marks. In the event of a tie the dressage score takes precedence followed by the fastest jumping time.

1. Open to all horses/ponies, regardless of BD points. Riders may be any age.

2. Lead Rein permitted (unplaced Lead Rein Competitors will receive a Rosette) and must ride RDA Intro 1 (2012). Lead Rein Competitors must state they are Lead Rein for the duration of the Show when entering.

3. Non Lead Rein Competitors must ride BD Intro Test A (2008).

4. Horses/Ponies may only compete once.

Arena 20m x 40m

5. The same horse/pony/rider combination may not compete in classes 2 to 9 inclusive.

6. The highest percentage score regardless of the test ridden will be the winner.

7. In the event of equality, the Competitor with the highest collective marks will be the winner.

The Highest placed Lead Rein and Highest placed Non Lead Rein receive Special Rosettes & Awards donated by Miss P Doran and Ms H Staples.

Entry Fee £15.50 (Including the £1 non-refundable Judge's Fee charged per Competitor entered) (503) BD Prelim Test No. 13 (2006) or (504) BD Novice Test No 28 (2008) Arena 20m x 40m

Judge: Mrs R Collins (Berkshire)

1. Open to all horses/ponies, regardless of BD points. Riders may be any age.

2. Competitors may ride either of the tests listed but must state which on entry form.

3. Horses/Ponies may only compete once.

4. The highest percentage score regardless of the test ridden will be the winner.

5. In the event of equality, the Competitor with the highest collective marks will be the winner.

The Winner receives the Sue Brenton Memorial Trophy donated by Area 8. The Highest Placed Junior receives the Executive Jet Trophy donated by The Senior Family.

Class 4 The Richterhof Riding Club Restricted Dressage

The Highest Placed Junior receives the Malvern Cup. The Highest Placed Horse/Pony, ridden by an Adult which has not been placed first or second in affiliated dressage, with less than 10 BD points at time of entry or been placed 1st or 2nd in a dressage class at a previous National Side Saddle Show receives the Kim Reed Cup donated by Kim Reed.

The Highest Placed Competitor riding a pony not exceeding 148cm (14.2hh) receives a Patterned Mug donated by the late Mr L Moul. The Highest Placed Competitor riding a horse exceeding 148cm (14.2hh) receives a Patterned Mug donated by the late Mr L Moul.

3. Competitor/horse/pony combinations may enter/compete more than once but with a different test.

4. The highest percentage score, regardless of the test ridden, will be the winner.

5. In the event of equality, the Competitor with the highest collective marks will be the winner.

Open to all horses/ponies, regardless of BD points, ridden by an Adult. The **Winner** receives the **Joie de Vivre Bronze**, donated by her family, in memory of the late **Mrs L Gray**, and a **SASH** sponsored by **SSA Area 5**.

ROCOCO & CARO CRIPPS MEMORIAL PAS SEULS

1. *Entries accepted* – The combined number of entries accepted for the two classes will be 25 and accepted on a first received basis. Additional entries will be wait listed.

2. Times - See General Show Rules for Times information.

3. Horse/Pony Tack etc - Side Saddles, Bridles, Boots, Costumes, etc., worn, should be safe and fit correctly, but may be decorated, appropriately.

4. Rider's Costumes, Headwear, Props & Helpers - Any Costumes or Footwear may be worn and Adults may wear a hat which does not conform to current British Safety Standards or above and any Props / Helpers incorporated, at Competitors' own risk.

5. Tests – Tests may not be verbally commanded or performed on the lead rein.

6. Scoring – See below but in the event of equality of marks, the highest marks for Overall Entertainment & Presentation, achieved from both Judges, shall be the Winner; if not conclusive the highest marks for Way of Going and Harmony between Rider and Horse/Pony, achieved from both Judges, shall be the Winner; if not conclusive the results shall be declared a tie.

7. Music and Précis – Both must be handed in at the Show Office at least 2 hours before the start of the Class, be CLEARLY marked with the Competitor's Name, Number, Class Number AND any specific instructions concerning the music. (NB PLEASE COLLECT AFTERWARDS!)

Each class will be run as a Freestyle to Music Class in a 20m x 60m Arena and should be ridden in a Costume themed to match and enhance the Music used. A brief précis about the Pas Seul (Max 50 words) **must be** submitted. Music must be between $4\frac{1}{2}$ and 5 minutes, and will be timed from opening to closing halt. Penalties will be incurred for exceeding the time allowed.

REQUIREMENTS: Walk, Trot and Canter on both reins at any level; all types of movements may be used but degree of difficulty may not always gain higher marks and must be correctly executed.

OPTIONAL: Static Props may be carried/used, 1 or 2 Static props and 1 or 2 Helpers may be incorporated **BUT ALL PROP/HELPERS** may only enter the International Arena, and be removed from, at the same time as and within the time allowed for each competitor (7 minutes including performance time).

SCORING: The Judges will **USE THE SAME MARK SHEET and EACH** allocate a total mark of 100 marks for: 1. **Way and Going and Harmony** between Rider and Horse/Pony 20

- 2. **Music**, which appropriately enhances the Pas Seul and the Performance 20
- 3. **Costume**, which is most suitable to the Rider, Horse/Pony and the Performance 20

4. Overall Entertainment, Performance and Presentation


